The Federal Register (the daily newspaper of the Federal Government) is a legal newspaper published every business day by the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA). The NARA's Office of the Federal Register prepares the Federal Register for publication in partnership with the Government Printing Office (GPO). GPO distributes the Federal Register in paper, on microfiche, and on the World Wide Web. The Federal Register, created by Federal Register Act of 1935, contains Federal Agency Regulations, Proposed Rules and Public Notices, Executive Orders, Proclamations and other Presidential Documents. Before the 1935 act, there were no facilities within the executive branch of the federal government for the central filing and publication of those documents. To keep track of the amendments to the regulations, in 1938 Congress amended the Federal Register Act to create the *Code of Federal Regulations* (CFR). The *Code of Federal Regulations* is an annually revised codification of the general and permanent rules published in the *Federal Register*, divided into fifty titles that represent broad areas subject to federal regulation

Agencies must provide the public with notice of proposed regulations to give citizens an opportunity to participate in policy making. The public may submit comments and relevant data and agencies must respond to public comments and justify final decisions. Agencies carry out these responsibilities by publishing rulemaking documents in the Federal Register. Final Rules published in the Federal Register become part of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR).

The Federal Register informs citizens of their rights and obligations and provides access to a wide range of Federal Benefits and opportunities for funding. The Federal Register is very important to all citizens conducting a business that is regulated by a Federal Agency. Organizations conducting business in Government Contracting is a prime example. Notices, including scheduled hearings and meetings open to the public, grant applications, administrative orders, and other announcements of government actions are included in the Federal Register.

Articles and updates pertaining to a selected subject can be sent automatically to a designated email account. Select the "Search" link at the bottom of the page.
