On Regulations.gov, you can find and comment on proposed regulations and related documents published by the U.S. Federal government. You can also find:

- Guidance

- Comments submitted by others
- The Unified Agenda and Regulatory Plan

You will not find:

- Public Laws
- Code of Federal Regulations

After Congressional bills become laws, Federal Agencies are responsible for putting those laws into action through regulations. Final rules can be accessed on Regulations.gov

Twice a year in the spring and fall, each agency publishes a Regulatory Agenda (also known as the Unified Agenda or Semi-Annual Agenda). The Regulatory Agenda provides information about regulations that each agency plans to issue or has recently completed.

Regulations.gov allows you to receive alerts when changes or additions occur in a docket folder (a collection of documents related to a rulemaking or other action). To subscribe, navigate to a docket folder, click the "sign up for email alerts" link and enter your email address.

To search for a specific docket folder or to peruse by subject matter, enter a keyword (for example; "contracts") in the "search box" located on the navigation bar.
