



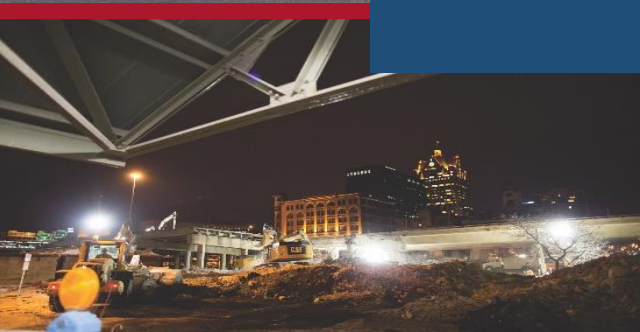

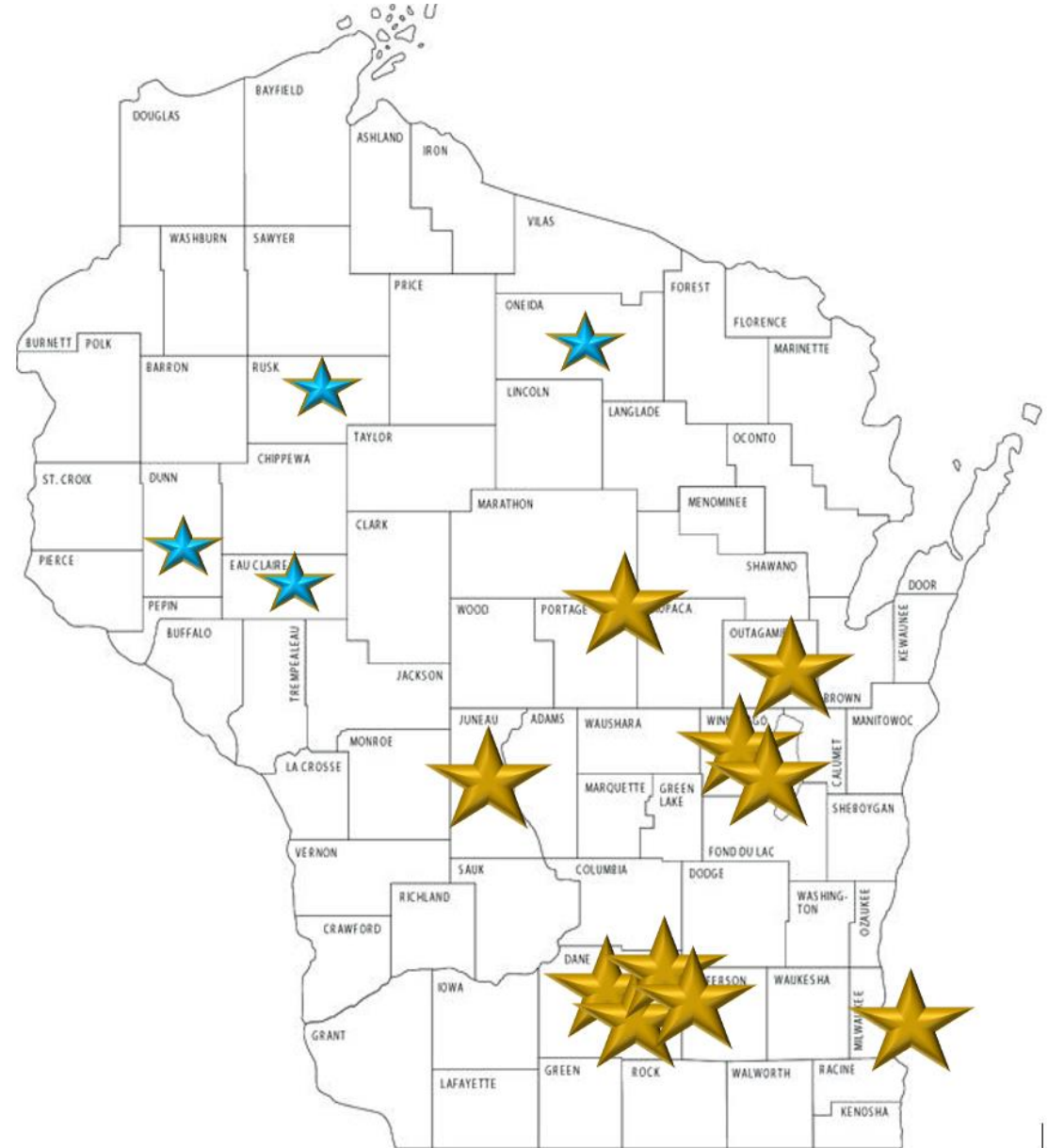

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

THE PROGRAM

- The DBE program started with Surface Transportation Assistance Act of 1982, which set a national goal of placing at least 10 percent of federal highway and transit funds with persons who qualify as disadvantaged small business operators. A subsequent act in 1987 included women.
- The State of Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) invests \$600-700 million annually in federal and state dollars for highway, airport and transit projects. These funds translate into millions of dollars in transportation-related contracts and project work for DBE firms.

THE PROGRAM

Goals

- The program goals for DBE participation covers three modal administrations:
- **Highways:** WisDOT's projected DBE goal calculation is 12.32% for October 1, 2018 – September 30, 2020.
- **Transit:** For the period beginning October 1, 2016, and ending September 30, 2019, WisDOT has set an overall transit DBE goal of 1.10% for DBE participation.
- **Airports:** FFY 2017-2019 goal of 6.04% for Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) airport construction projects. The goal is for DBE participation on contracts assisted by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA).

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT

- Who qualifies as a DBE?
- **51 % owned and controlled by disadvantaged person(s).** Small Business Status – must be a **small business** as defined by SBA size standards. It must not have annual average gross receipts over \$23.98MM in the previous 3 years or \$56.42MM for airport concessionaires. Personal net worth less than \$1.32MM excluding home & ownership in business.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT

- Disadvantaged Status
 - **Definition:** Socially Disadvantaged Status - Belong to an ethnic minority group: Native American, Black, Hispanic, Asian Indian, Asian Pacific or women.
 - Individuals who are not members of one of the groups above can be found to be socially disadvantaged as defined by Appendix E of 49 CFR Part 26. [Electronic Code of Federal Regulations 49 CFR Part 26](#)

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT

- Personal Net worth (Economically Disadvantaged)
 - **Definition:** Each individual owner of a firm applying to participate as a DBE, whose ownership and control are relied upon for DBE certification must certify that he or she has a personal net worth that does not exceed \$1.32 million.
 - Exclude an individual's ownership interest in the applicant firm
 - Exclude the individual's equity in his or her primary residence

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT

- Ownership
 - **Definition:** 51 % owned and controlled by disadvantaged person(s).
 - The firm's ownership by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals, including their contribution of capital or expertise to acquire their ownership interests, must be **real, substantial, and continuing**, going beyond pro forma ownership of the firm as reflected in ownership documents.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT

- Ownership
 - Examples:
 - An individual pays \$100 to acquire a majority interest in a firm worth \$1 million. The individual's contribution to capital would not be viewed as substantial.
 - A 51% disadvantaged owner and a non-disadvantaged 49% owner contribute \$100 and \$10,000, respectively, to acquire a firm grossing \$1 million. This may be indicative of a pro forma arrangement that does not meet the requirements
 - The disadvantaged owner of a DBE applicant firm spends \$250 to file articles of incorporation and obtains a \$100,000 loan, but makes only nominal or sporadic payments to repay the loan. This type of contribution is not of a continuing nature.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT

- Control
 - **Definition:** Only an independent business may be certified as a DBE. An independent business is one the viability of which does not depend on its relationship with another firm or firms.
 - Exercise of power/decision making/general management by non Disadvantaged individuals, family members must not prevent the DBE owners to run their business.
 - Delegation of authority must be revocable

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT

- Small Business Status
 - **Definition:** To be an eligible DBE, a firm (including its affiliates) must be an existing small business, as defined by Small Business Administration (SBA) standards.
 - The business size standard must be according to the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) code(s) of to the type(s) of work the firm seeks to perform in DOT-assisted contracts.
 - Even if it meets the requirements, a firm is not an eligible DBE in any Federal fiscal year if the firm (including its affiliates) has had average annual gross receipts, as defined by SBA regulations over the firm's previous three fiscal years, in excess of \$23.98 million.

APPLICATION PROCESS

APPLICATION PROCESS

- First time applicants for DBE certification must:
 - Fill in the UCP application
 - submit the application with all related material to the nearest DBE/Airport Concession DBE (ACDBE) Program Certifying Agency
 - Participate in an Onsite Interview conducted by the Certifying Agency
- General time frame is about 90 days

APPLICATION PROCESS

- Renewing the certification
 - In 2014, USDOT provided new guidance to certifiers in the DBE Program with a 180-page document called the 2014 Final Rule.
 - One of the provision in the Final Rule ended recertification (Wisconsin UCP required a five-year renewal process)
 - Since November of 2014, once a firm becomes approved to participate in the DBE Program, only the Annual No Change Affidavit process is required.

APPLICATION PROCESS


- Maintaining the certification
 - A DBE must provide to the recipient, every year on the anniversary of the date of your certification, an affidavit sworn to by the firm's owners before a person who is authorized by State law to administer oaths or an unsworn declaration executed under penalty of perjury of the laws of the United States.
 - This affidavit must affirm that there have been no changes in the firm's circumstances affecting its ability to meet size, disadvantaged status, ownership, or control requirements of this part or any material changes in the information provided in its application form, except for changes about which you have notified the recipient.
 - The affidavit shall specifically affirm that your firm continues to meet SBA business size criteria and the overall gross receipts cap of this part, documenting this affirmation with supporting documentation of your firm's size and gross receipts (e.g., submission of Federal tax returns).

APPLICATION PROCESS

- Maintaining the certification
- You must inform the UCP in writing of any change in circumstances affecting your ability to meet size, disadvantaged status, ownership, or control requirements of this part or any material change in the information provided in your application form.
 - (1) Changes in management responsibility among members of a limited liability company are covered by this requirement.
 - (2) You must attach supporting documentation describing in detail the nature of such changes.
 - (3) The notice must take the form of an affidavit sworn to by the applicant before a person who is authorized by state law to administer oaths or of an unsworn declaration executed under penalty of perjury of the laws of the United States. You must provide the written notification within 30 days of the occurrence of the change.

- Remember:
- Prevailing wage compliance:
 - Both federal and state law establish mandatory prevailing wage rates for each employment classification.
- Payroll submission (CRCS) compliance
 - Prevailing wage compliance includes the requirement that contractors enter electronic payrolls weekly through WisDOT's Civil Rights Compliance System (CRCS).

HOW TO LEVERAGE YOUR DBE

- Additional certifications – Additional Opportunities
 - In 2012, Executive Order #72 required the Department of Administration to waive certification application requirements from other state, federal, local or private businesses if their certification procedures are “substantially equivalent” to those of the State of Wisconsin. To streamline certification and reduce duplication, DOA entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Wisconsin Department of Transportation’s Office of Business Opportunity and Equity Compliance and other entities in the Unified Certification Program in 2013. Through it, the DOA Supplier Diversity Program grants certification to firms that meet the State of Wisconsin certification eligibility requirements using their UCP certification.

HOW TO LEVERAGE YOUR DBE

 - When a firm currently certified in Wisconsin applies to another State for DBE certification, the State may, at its discretion, accept Wisconsin's certification and certify the firm, without further procedures.
 - To obtain certification in this manner, the firm must provide a copy of its certification notice
 - If the State does not accept the certification,
 - You must provide a complete copy of the application form, all supporting documents, and any other information you have submitted to the State of Wisconsin. This includes affidavits of no change (see §26.83(j)) and any notices of changes (see §26.83(i)) that you have submitted to the State of Wisconsin, as well as any correspondence you have had with the State of Wisconsin's UCP or any other recipient concerning your application or status as a DBE firm.

HOW TO LEVERAGE YOUR DBE

- Mentor-Protégé Agreement
- Benefit to the Mentor:
 - Receive payment for time training a certified DBE firm under a WisDOT Specialty Services Contract
 - Receive 2% markup on WisDOT contracts when the protégé is a subcontractor to the mentor
 - Receive Name Recognition as a WisDOT Small Business Development Mentor

HOW TO LEVERAGE YOUR DBE

- Mentor-Protégé Agreement
- Benefit to the Protégé:
 - Received structured business development from a valued WisDOT Consultant Firm
 - Insider perspective on Best Practices
 - Access to WisDOT Training Catalogue
 - Opportunity for Paid Accredited Training

HOW TO LEVERAGE YOUR DBE

- Mentor-Protégé Agreement
- ACQUAINTED PAIRS:
 - A mentor and a protégé enter into the program on their own initiative.
- UNACQUAINTED PAIRS:
 - WisDOT initiates and facilitates the pairing of the mentor and the protégé
- The Mentor/Protégé Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) will remain in effect for three years with the possibility of a two-year extension.
