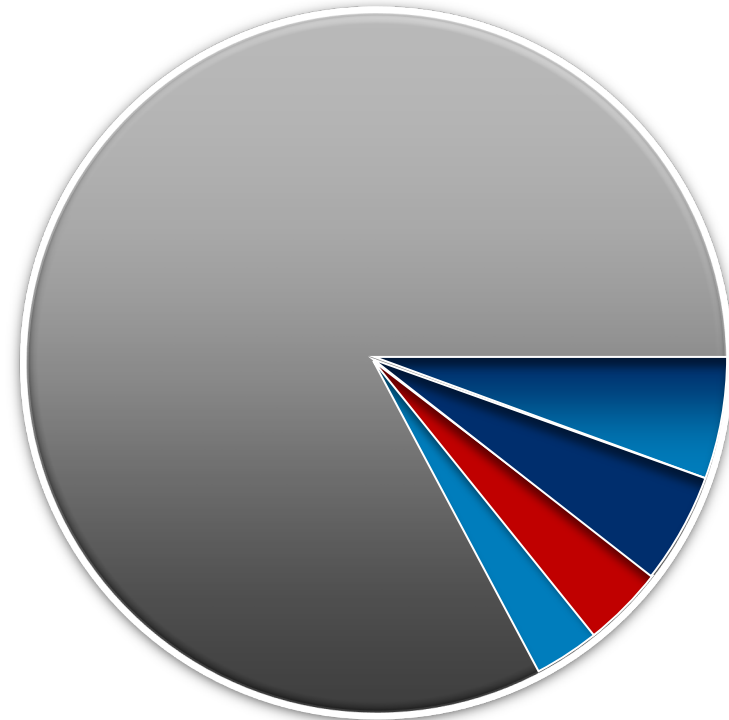

# WOSB and EDWOSB Set-Aside Contracts



## Industry

### WOSB

NAICS code assigned to contract is in an industry where WOSBs are **substantially underrepresented**

### EDWOSB

NAICS code assigned to contract is in an industry where WOSBs are **underrepresented**

## Rule of Two

Contracting officer has reasonable expectation that 2 or more WOSBs will submit an offer

## Award Price

Contract must be awarded at fair market price

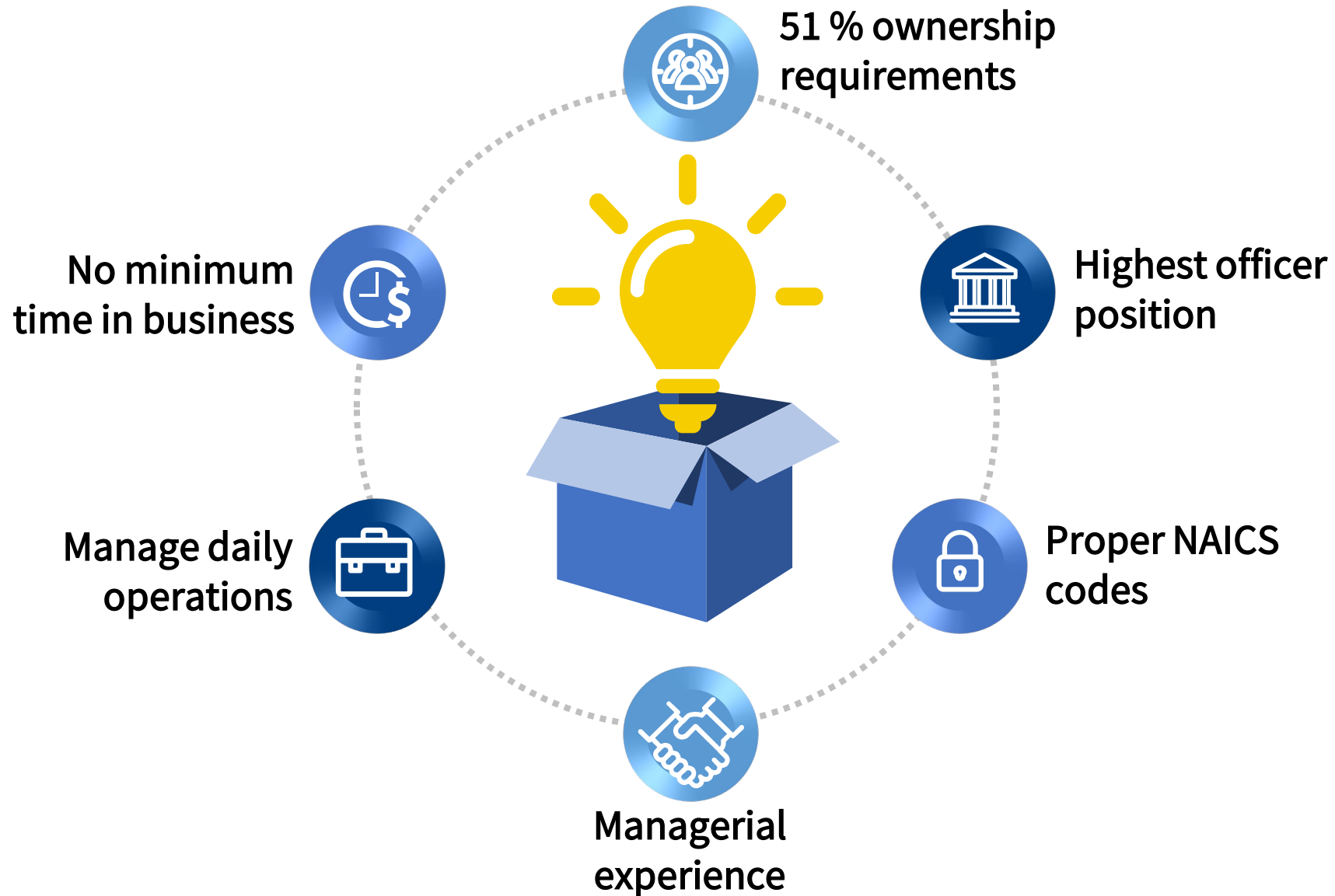

# Certification Changes

➤ **As of October 15, 2020, businesses are required to be certified either through:**

- SBA's new, free online certification process (<https://beta.certify.sba.gov/>)

or

- through an approved TPC, at a cost, in order to compete for WOSB Program set-aside contracts.

## Will Other Certifications Be Accepted?

Currently, the SBA will accept current 8(a) participants, approved third-party certificates, and certifications from the CVE.

- **Current 8(a) Program Participants**—Upload most recent annual review letter or their 8(a) acceptance letter if the firm is in program year 1
- **Third-Party Certified**—Upload of WOSB and/or EDWOSB certificate
- **CVE**—Upload certificate and supporting documentation

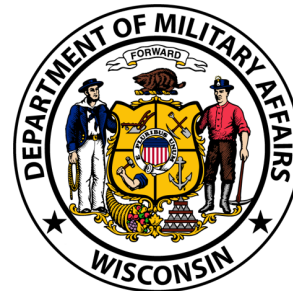

# How does the state purchase construction?

## Projects > \$300,000

(MEP subcontractors are selected via State bidding process.  
Primes don't choose MEP subcontractors.)

- MEP subcontractors submit their bid two weeks prior to the GPC bid opening (certification is required)
- The State identifies the lowest qualified bidder for each MEP division of work for the GPC to use on their bid
- All other non-MEP subcontractors are selected by the GPC (certification not required)



## Projects <= \$300,000

(Primes choose all subcontractors.)

- Prime Contractors submit their bid using their own selected subcontractors
- Certification is not required for subcontractors who do not bid directly to the State
- Subcontractors may obtain a WisBuild account to appear on plan holders lists for projects they are interested in

# Unified certification program (ucp)

# Unified certification program (UCP)

- **Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) – UCP**
  - **NOTE:** The DBE certification is part of the UCP – there are multiple certifying agencies and multiple agencies accept DBE certification. This will be discussed in more detail later in the presentation. **The UCP Certification Program does not have the one year In Business requirement.**
  - **Definition of Minority & Disadvantaged:** Disadvantaged Status - Belong to an ethnic minority group: Native American, Black, Hispanic, Asian Indian, Asian Pacific or women.
  - Any individual deemed as socially disadvantaged resulting from circumstances beyond their control per 49 CFR part 29
  - **Eligibility Requirement** – 51 % owned and controlled by disadvantaged person(s). Small Business Status – must be a small business as defined by SBA size standards. It must not have annual average gross receipts over \$26.29M in the previous 3 years or \$56.42M for airport concessionaires. Personal net worth less than \$1.32M excluding home & ownership in business.
  - No cost
  - Re-evaluated every 3 years

# Unified certification program (UCP)

- **Where and How do I get certified?**

- Contact one of the four certifying agencies - Wisconsin Department of Transportation, Milwaukee County – Community Business Development Partners, Dane County Purchasing Division- Contract Compliance or City of Madison Department of Civil Rights – Target Business Enterprise Program.

- The federal DBE program requires all DBE firms to submit an annual affidavit and business taxes annually.

- **Milwaukee County Online Certification**: processes applications submitted by firms interested in working on projects that are partially funded by the USDOT, FAA, FHWA, or FTA. The County of Milwaukee shall process applications for airport concessionaires located anywhere in this state.

  - National goal of placing at least 10 percent of federal highway and transit funds with persons who qualify as disadvantaged small business operators.
- UCP is a cooperative of 24 different Wisconsin cities, counties, airport and transit authorities that benefit from USDOT funding – incorporate DBE goals into their federally funded transportation projects.

# Local governments

- **City of Madison** – Targeted Business Certification Program
- The MADcertification Program is the targeted business certification program of the City of Madison. The program has been designed to perform the function of certifying targeted businesses for participation on City projects with targeted business goals including WBE's.
- **Where and How do you get certified?**
  - Certification available online at: <http://www.cityofmadison.com/civil-rights/documents/AAPInstructions.pdf> and must be submitted to City of Madison, Affirmative Action Division, 210 Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd., Rm. 523 , Madison, WI 53703.
- **Certification length** – Recertification annually
- **Cost for Certification** – There is no cost for certification.

- **Milwaukee County** – DBE Program

  - Community Business Development Partners (CBDP) administers the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE), Small Business Enterprise (SBE) and Airport Concession Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (ACDBE) programs. # Milwaukee county

- Milwaukee County strives to meet a Targeted Business Enterprise goal across all county services of 25% for construction related activities and 17% for all other procurement and professional service activities. Milwaukee County reviews RFP's and past history data as well as looking at departmental activities and achievement history to determine the appropriate goals using the US DOT recommendations for determining availability by NAICS code and utilizing US Census and other available data.
- US DOT Goal Setting - FAA DBE
  - Milwaukee County General Mitchell International Airport has budgeted FAA-assisted contracts for FFY2017-2019 totaling **\$23,029,500**. The overall DBE goal is 19.3%, 7.7% will be race-neutral and 11.6% race-conscious.
  - The County has set the following preliminary goals for DBE participation on these contracts by sector:
    - Construction Projects: **20.6%** of funds anticipated for construction projects
    - Professional Services/Procurement: **6.6%** of funds anticipated for professional services and procurement of equipment

- **Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD)** – Small, Veteran, Women, Minority (SWMBE) Businesses – 318 certified in their database
  - To apply for MMSD SBE certification, businesses must complete the application.

MMSD SBE Certification is valid for three years. Firms wishing to renew their certification must submit a new application and business tax returns for the past three years.

- Effective December 5, 2017, the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD) modified its Small Business Enterprise (SBE) certification program to align with the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) in its definition of a small business. Previously, MMSD defined a small business as a business not exceeding 2.5 million in gross sales during the most recent calendar or fiscal year. **Moving forward, a small business is defined as a business not exceeding the SBA size standard for its industry.** A size standard represents the largest size that a business (including its subsidiaries and affiliates) may be to remain classified as a small business. SBA size standards vary by industry classification and can be defined by average annual receipts for the past three years or average number of employees over the past twelve months. Businesses can use the [SBA size standards tool](#) to determine if their business can be classified as a small business.

## How to Register as an SWMBE Vendor

All firms interested in doing business are encouraged to register in MMSD's [contract and vendor management system](#). Completing the vendor registration does not guarantee a contract with MMSD but will allow firms to receive communication and notices for relevant procurement opportunities with the District.

Please note: Firms seeking SWMBE certification must be registered before their certification can be approved.

## MMSD Small Business Certification

To apply for MMSD SBE certification, businesses must complete the [Small Business Certification application](#). MMSD SBE Certification is valid for three years. Firms wishing to renew their certification must submit a new application and business tax returns for the past three years.

To be eligible for SBE certification, firms must meet the size standard for its industry as set forth by the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA). A size standard represents the largest size that a business (including its subsidiaries and affiliates) may be to remain classified as a small business. SBA size standards vary by industry classification and can be defined by average annual receipts for the past three years or the average number of employees over the past twelve months.

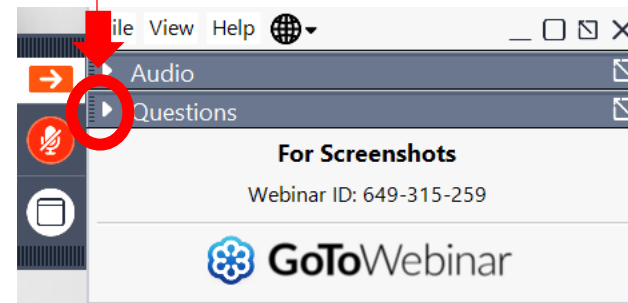
- Never imply the Government must purchase from you since you have a certification

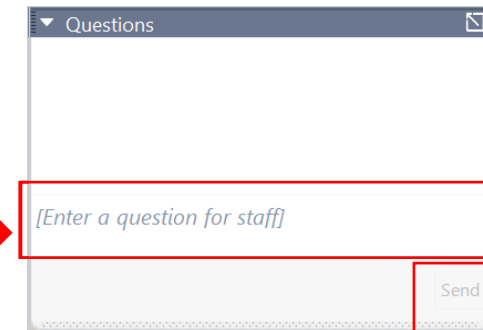

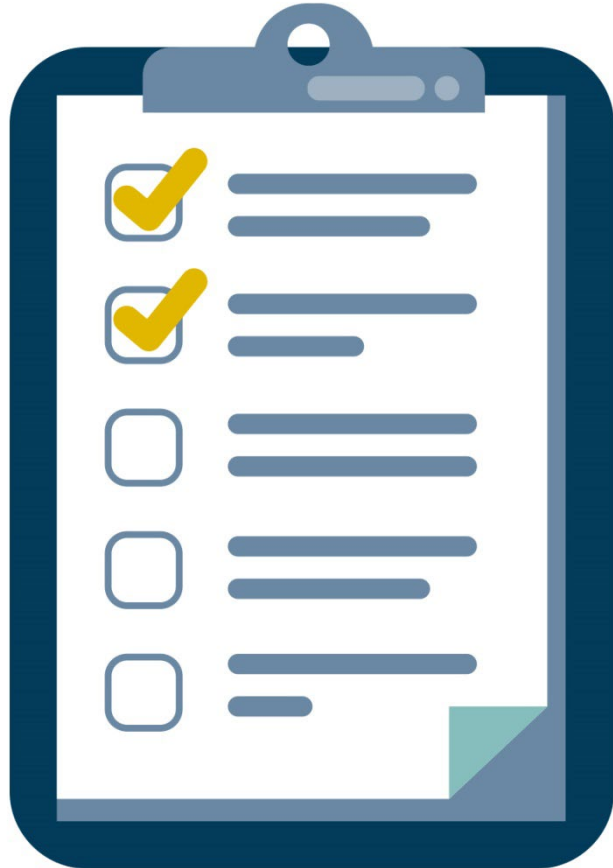
