- Selling to DoD sounds simple and straightforward. After all, how hard can it be to sell to “a single customer that publicly publishes the majority of its business opportunities?” In reality, DoD is a large and complex Global entity with approximately 982 Contracting Offices each with varying requirements that span from everyday items to those which can only be described as intricate and esoteric. Additionally, DoD uses a variety of acquisition vehicles to procure both products and services. This webinar will provide an overview of the essential data needed to gain an understanding of this marketplace and associated purchasing trends. It will also help you to identify and qualify prospects.

Show Stoppers

- Lack of required registrations (SAM, DIBBS, JCP, ITAR, SPRS, Other)
- Failure to maintain Active Status/Currency SPRS < 3 years
- Source of opportunities – solicitations
- Qualifications – NSN, QPL, QML, etc
- Ability to meet requirements – e.g. Rated Orders
- Delivery date
- Responsible – key factor
- Past Performance – used in award process

JCP SPSR/SAM Requirement

Note: ***JCP now requires all vendors to have their National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) Assessment documented in the [Supplier Performance Risk System \(SPRS\)](#)  prior to submitting your JCP Application*** **Effective 30 November 2020**, the Defense Federal Acquisition Regulation Clause 252.204-7012 requires all DOD contractors and subcontractors to implement cybersecurity requirements in the NIST Special Publication (SP) 800-171, Protecting Controlled Unclassified Information in Nonfederal Systems and Organizations. Your NIST assessment results must be documented in the [SPRS](#)  ***Failure to have a NIST assessment documented in SPRS will result in a denial of your request for an approved DD Form 2345. *** Please go to the [SPRS homepage](#)  and use the vendor quick reference guides to help you complete the process. There is also an SPRS support number on the bottom of the homepage that you can call for assistance with getting directions on how to complete the process.

Note: Additionally, your company must register in [SAM](#)  and it must be current and active in order to obtain a JCP Certification.

The DD 2345

- Bid on a DOD solicitation or execute a DOD contract that involves access to export controlled technical
- Conference/meeting attendance that discusses/shares DOD/DND export-controlled material/data
- DOD/DND export controlled technical data exchange between vendors
- Obtain Request for Proposal (RFP) details involving DOD/DND export controlled data
- DOD Research/Development projects involving export controlled data
- Participation in a Directly Arranged Visit (DAV) (Canada to U.S. or U.S. to Canada)

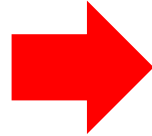

RQ032: EXPORT CONTROL OF TECHNICAL DATA



This item has technical data some or all of which is subject to export-control of either the International Traffic in Arms regulations (ITAR) or the Export Administration Regulations (EAR), and cannot be exported without prior authorization from either the Department of State or the Department of Commerce. Export includes disclosure of technical data to foreign persons and nationals whether located in the United States or abroad. This requirement applies equally to foreign national employees and U.S. companies and their foreign subsidiaries. DFARS 252.225-7048 is applicable to this data.

The Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) limits distribution of export-control technical data to DLA contractors that have an approved US/Canada Joint Certification Program (JCP) certification, have completed the Introduction to Proper Handling of DOD Export-Controlled Technical Data Training and the DLA Export-Controlled Technical Data Questionnaire (both are available at the web address given below), and have been approved by the DLA controlling authority to access the export-controlled data. To be eligible for award, offerors and any sources of supply proposed for use are required to have an approved JCP certification and have been approved by the DLA controlling authority to access export-controlled data managed by DLA. DLA will not delay award in order for an offeror or its supplier to apply for and receive approval by the DLA controlling authority to access the export-controlled data.

What are some obstacles?

- Terms and Conditions (Clauses – FAR/DFARS)
- Registrations – SAM/JCP/~SPRS
- Information Security -> cyber security
- Qualifications
- Frequency/Delivery (ARO)
- Socio-economic restrictions
- Source availability – materials as specified
- Specs, standards, materials
- Vetting suppliers/subcontractors

How many contracts are needed?

- The real question is how many solicitations are required?
- Hypothetical –
 - Desired revenue - \$150,000
 - Average award - \$5,000
 - Number of awards - 30

The issue

- For easy math – 10::1 Bid to Win ratio
- 30 awards * 10 = 300 solicitations
- Roughly 260 workdays per year
- Therefore, greater than one opportunity per business day
- Options
 - Identify a large number of opportunities
 - Work to decrease “bid to win” ratio
 - Select opportunities that yield an average revenue greater than \$5,000

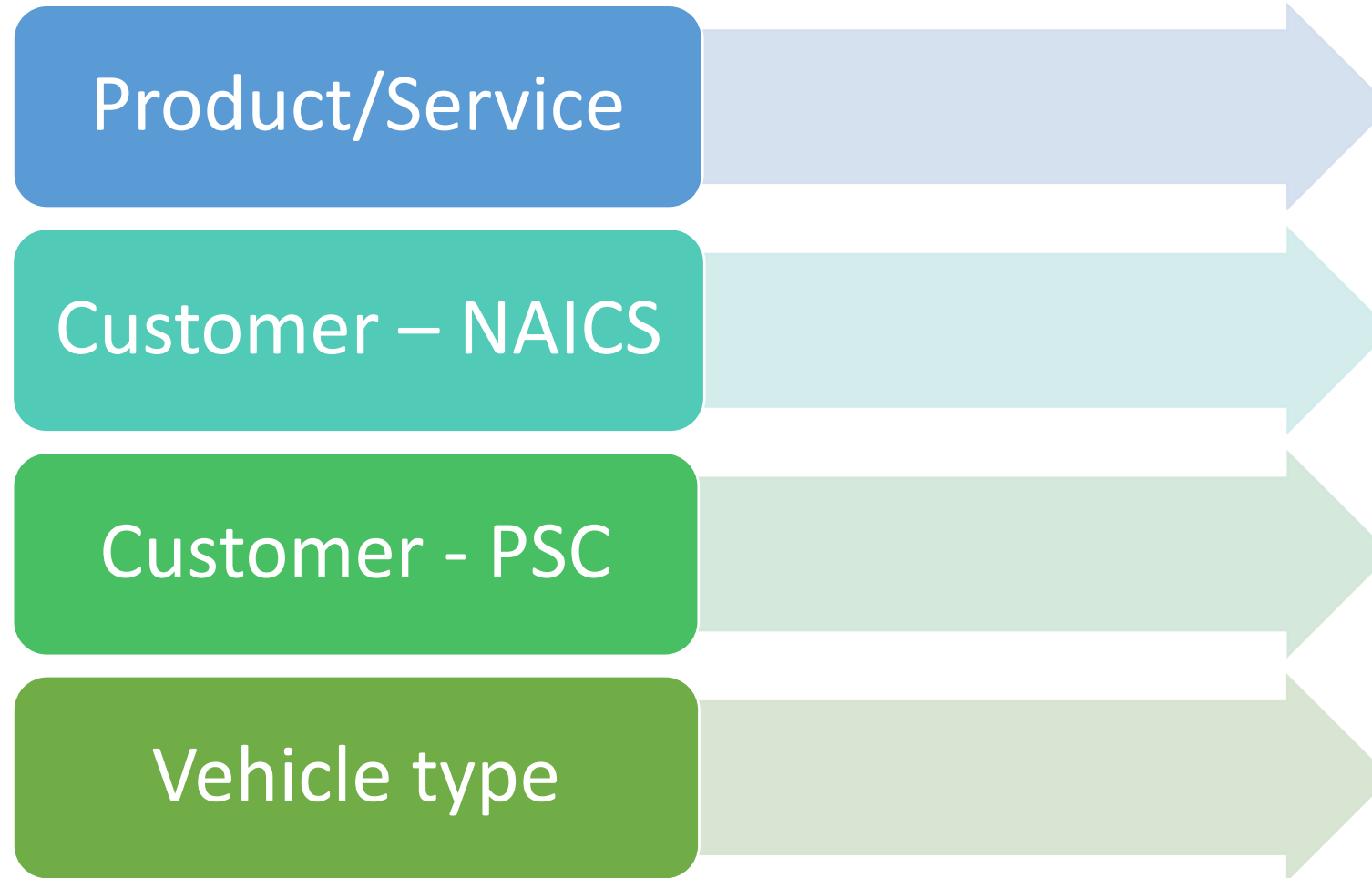

Why it is important to know - resources

- Contract Data Reports
 - Metrics - > values
 - Attributes -> elements that characterize Metrics
 - Provides information on Award/Contract Type
 - Allows – Obligation filtering (>\$0.00 and <= \$10,000)
 - Number of bids submitted

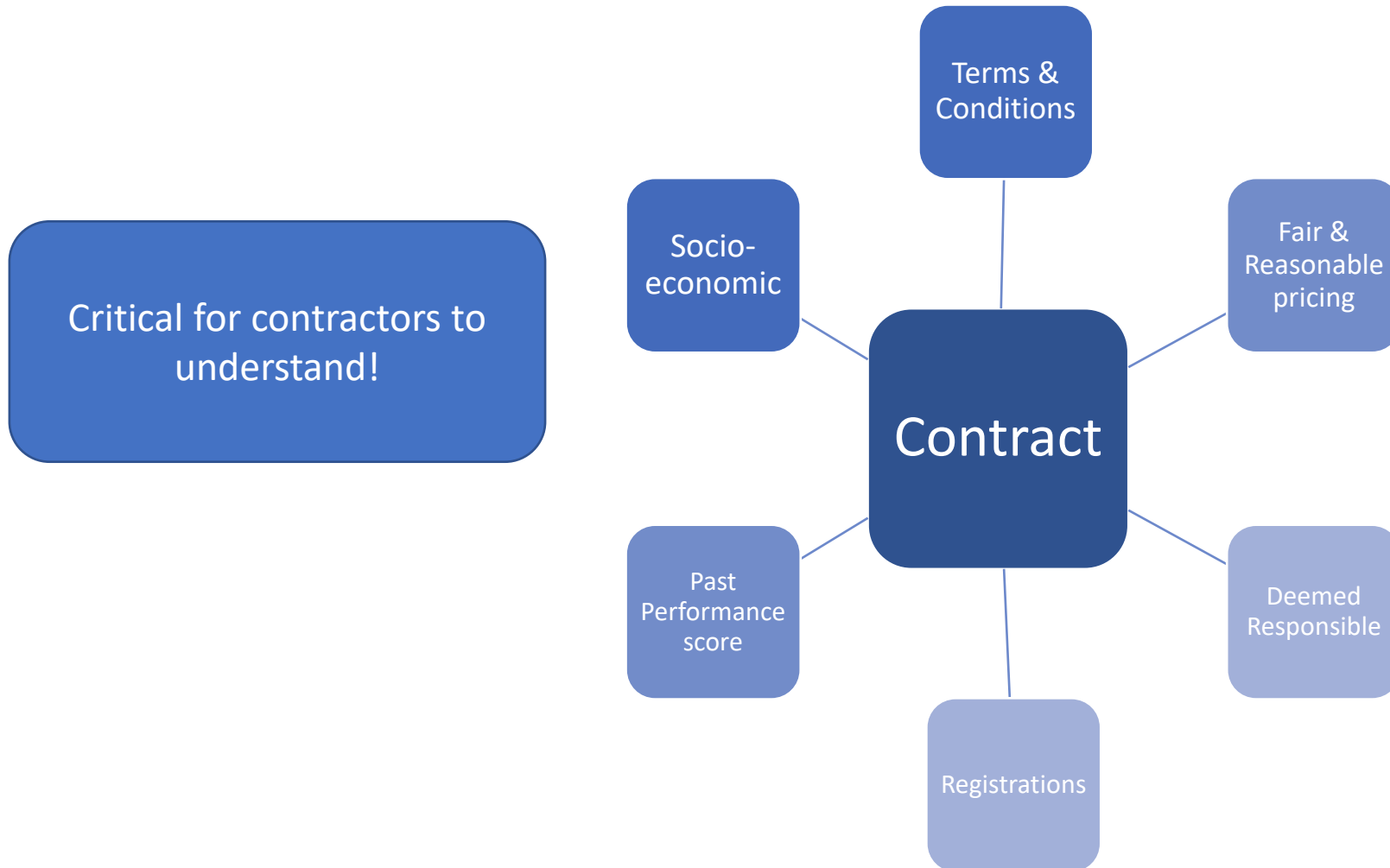

Responsibility (FAR part 9.103 Policy)

- (a) Purchases shall be made from, and contracts shall be awarded to, *responsible prospective contractors* only.
- (b) No purchase or award shall be made unless the contracting officer makes an affirmative determination of responsibility. In the absence of information clearly indicating that the prospective contractor is responsible, the contracting officer shall make a determination of nonresponsibility.

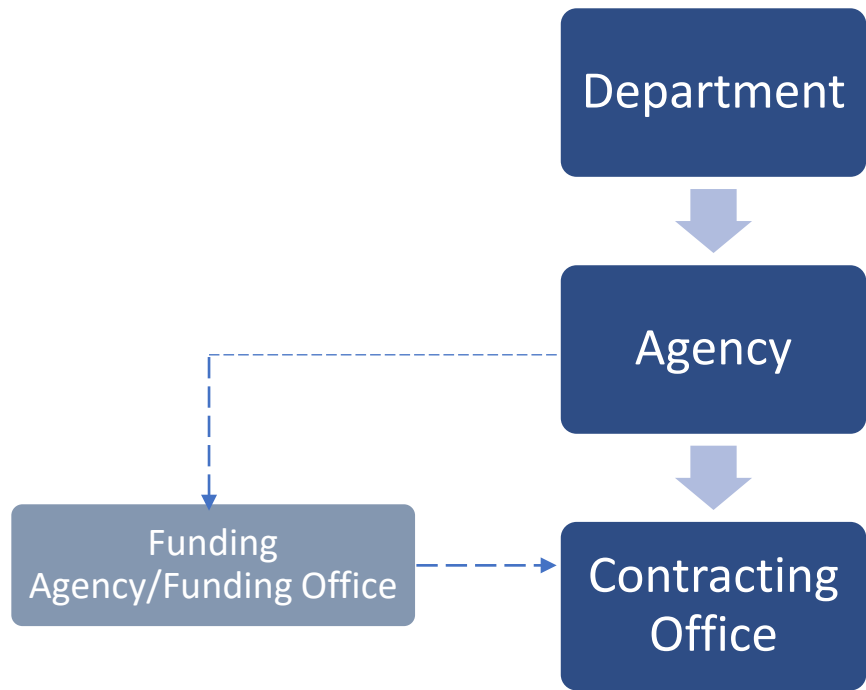

Acquisition “codes”- NAICS v. PSC

- The contracting officer shall determine the appropriate NAICS code by classifying the product or service being acquired in the one industry that best describes the principal purpose of the supply or service being acquired. FAR 19.102 (b) NAICS used in the contract does not have to match a business' NAICS in SAM
- The Product and Service Codes (PSC) Manual provides codes to describe products, services, and research and development (R&D) purchased by the federal government. These codes indicate “WHAT” was bought for each contract action reported in the Federal Procurement Data System (FPDS).
